



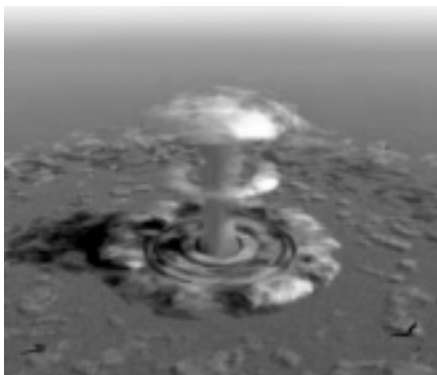
What is “PUGWASH”...it started with a manifesto

During the height of the Cold War, Albert Einstein, Bertrand Russell, and other eminent scientists issued a manifesto urging scientists to "think in a new way" about their moral responsibilities in the nuclear age. As a result, a conference was held in Pugwash, Nova Scotia, bringing together some of the greatest scientific minds to address nuclear weapons issues and the social responsibility of scientists. Today the purpose of the Pugwash Conferences is to gather, from around the world, influential scholars and public figures concerned with reducing the danger of armed conflict and seeking cooperative solutions for global problems. In 1995 the Pugwash Conferences on Science and World Affairs was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize for their work on nuclear disarmament.
